SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT

The development of this programme was inspired by a specific demand from industry to meet the clear need to upskill current personnel who have shown the aptitude and track record of competence in supply chain operations to aspire to a degree level qualification.

This one year, part-time programme, will develop participants' Supply Chain Management skills. It will provide education and practical application of the SCOR™ Framework concepts, enabling participating companies gain competitive

advantage through the application of the principles to drive improvement with measureable results.

A company-based project will form a key element of the programme, ensuring the integration of the various concepts in the participants' workplace.

It will provide participants with the practical the tools and techniques needed to understand Supply Chain Management within their own organisation.

PROGRAMME OF STUDY / DELIVERY

The programme comprises 10 modules (9 taught modules and 1 project), delivered through online blended learning; a combination of self-instructional materials and regular webinars and online tutorials).

It runs from September onwards for the following year and a quarter (15 months) primarily by on-line learning.

PROGRAMME OF STUDY

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A diploma/degree in any discipline from a third-level institution.

or

A NCEA National Diploma from a third-level institution

or

Equivalent qualification.

and

A minimum of 3 years working within a service/manufacturing/supply chain environment.

Candidates who do not meet the minimum entry criteria may be interviewed by the Programme Board to ascertain their suitability for the programme.

Successful completion of the UL Assessment of Experiential & Professional Skills module may be required by the Programme Board upon reviewing a candidate's application. The recognition of prior learning and prior experiential learning as per university policy will be applied to this programme.
