# What is the Buddy Programme?

Every semester UL students are matched with 2 to 3 newly arrived international students from all over the world. As with anyone who moves to a new area or enrolls in college, our international students need a little help and guidance in their initial few weeks in the university. Your role, as a Buddy, is to help make their transition to life in Limerick go smoothly by being open, flexible and responsive to their needs.

Every year, over 2,000 new international students enroll in UL on a wide variety of programmes. Students may be doing full-time undergraduate or postgraduate programmes, or partaking in Erasmus, Study Abroad or Exchange programmes for one to two semesters.

# THE BUDDY PROGRAMME BASICS

## Your Role as a Buddy is to:

- Be a friendly welcoming face to approximately three to four Buddies.
- Commit 12 – 20 hours a semester to your Buddies and the programme.
- Have a genuine interest in getting to know and interacting with your Buddies.
- Offer support and insider tips about UL.
- Maintain contact, even if your Buddies are feeling 'at home'.
- Be a good representative of the University of Limerick and Ireland.
- Your role as a buddy will not impede on your study time.

## Your Responsibilities are to:

- Make contact via email with your international Buddies in advance of the new term.
- Answer queries; provide information on the University and the locality on an on-going basis.
- Initiate a meeting with your international Buddies upon their arrival in Limerick.
- Take part in the Buddy events organised by UL Global
- Encourage your buddies to get involved with the UL community.

## You are an ambassador of UL and Ireland

Remember when interacting with your Buddies you are representing the university and Ireland. You play a role in giving new students a positive first impression of the country and to make them feel welcome in their new home for the next couple of months. Make an effort to connect with your buddy and support them. Be friendly, clear and open.

# How does the Buddy Programme Work?

- The University of Limerick Buddy Programme runs in the Autumn and Spring semesters.
- UL Global receives applications from new international students and matches them with UL volunteers.
- We match buddies according to their area of study, hobbies and language capabilities. We endeavour to match specific requests where possible.
- We will email you with the details of your international buddies.
- You reach out to your international buddies and organise your first meeting. This will be before the term begins.

- A chance to practise your language skills
- Learn about new cultures
- Make international connections for the future
- Help students from your own academic background
- Make friends with people from a different background
- Develop your communication skills
- A great addition to your CV!
- Earn volunteer hours towards the President's Volunteer Award which is displayed on your transcript.

## Buddy Programme Events

Each semester, UL Global organises a number of events for you and your buddies to attend. By signing up for the Buddy Programme, you have been added to our mailing list and will be notified of all events we have planned. You are not obliged to attend all of these events but you are required to notify your Buddy of them as the responsibility is on you to collect their tickets for such events, even if you do not plan to go. All events are held in accordance with public health and government COVID 19 guidelines.

## Things to do with your Buddy

On top of organising various virtual events we also encourage you to meet with your buddies over zoom when they first arrive and have a coffee together and get to know each other! We also encourage you to take the initiative to plan other virtual activities for you and your buddies, particularly ones that give them a taste of Irish life. When planning such events, it's important to keep in mind that other cultures have different ideas about what is an enjoyable and appropriate way to spend one's leisure time. There are many events happening all over campus throughout the semester and it is a good idea to keep an eye out for these too!

## Communicating with your Buddy

Maintain contact with your buddy and email them regularly. Periods such as the lead up to midterm breaks and the end of semester are when they may need some extra support and advice from you. Think carefully about how you communicate and how this may come across to someone from a different background. It can be easy to forget that we have quite a unique way of communicating in Ireland that might not always be easy for visitors to comprehend! You may use whatever platform you prefer to communicate, but initial contact will be made via email.

## Niamh, Applied Physics:


