*\*When working from French into their mother tongue, exchange students will be placed in third year classes wherever possible. When working from their mother tongue into French, students will be placed in either first or second year classes wherever possible, depending on their declared level of French or the number of years they have been studying French. It is recommended that exchange students do NOT choose specialised translation classes into French (even if the source language is their mother tongue) unless they have a level of French close or equivalent to C2.*

*Exchange students are strongly recommended to ensure that at least one of the languages in their translation language combination is their mother tongue.*

*In some cases, translation classes without French (for example, Spanish into English or vice versa) may also be available. Exchange students should enquire about such possibilities upon arrival at the start of term.*
