The H Thomas Hallowell Jr. Graduate Scholarship

The Scholarship shall be known as the H Thomas Hallowell Jr. Graduate Scholarship Programme. The Scholarship valued of €5,000 per annum, (paid monthly) will be awarded for a maximum of three years. The Scholarship shall be awarded to a research postgraduate student according to the following criteria:

- To an academically exceptional student studying for a Research Masters/PhD Degree in **Aeronautical Engineering**. A Preference shall be given to applications with a focus involving work with Alloys or Composites.
- The successful applicant may be either an existing or new research postgraduate student.
- The successful applicant must be a **full-time** research student, and either Irish citizen or permanent resident of Ireland as defined by the regulations of the University Finance Office.
- Once granted, the student shall hold the Scholarship for a maximum of three years, subject to the successful completion of the Annual Research Student Progression Process.

Application and Selection Procedures:

Interested students are invited to submit an application (*maximum 5 A4 pages, font Size 12*) comprising of the following:

- a. Covering letter outlining the reasons, including financial need and other funding sources, for applying for the scholarship (maximum 1 A4 page).
- b. Short curriculum vitae, including, contact details, University examination results/qualifications (maximum 1 A4 page).
- c. Summary of the proposed postgraduate research project, including a description of the project and its significance, the proposed timeframe of the research and a select bibliography (max 2 A4 pages).
- d. Letter of support (maximum 1 A4 page) from an existing or proposed primary supervisor of the research project.

A Scholarship's Committee, chaired by the Dean, Graduate & Professional Studies and comprising of the Assistant Dean's for Research, will assess applications, under the following criteria:

- Quality of the proposed research project
- Primary degree results
- The demonstrated need of the applicant

The selection committee may refrain from making a recommendation if they find no candidate of sufficient merit. The decision of the committee is final. With the consent of the benefactor the University may from time to time vary these regulations. A scholarship offer cannot be deferred.

Submission details and deadline

Applications must include (**6 copies collated and stapled; no covers, back to back printing preferred**).

Applicants must indicate name of the specific scholarship(s) they wish to be considered for.

Applications must be submitted to the Graduate School, Level 2, Foundation Building (F2-018); **closing date: Wednesday 30 May 2018 @ 5pm.**
