On 12 April, we introduced the use of the UL Student COVID-19 Day-Pass Portal for a trial period, which will finish at the end of this week.

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the workplace in line with HSE guidelines, all students coming on campus for lectures, practical classes, project work or library study were asked to **either** complete the UL Student COVID-19 Day-Pass Portal **or** to download and print off a PDF copy of the UL Student COVID-19 Self-Declaration Form.

The response to the Portal by the vast majority of students coming on campus has been positive with very few operational or other difficulties reported. All UL Staff and Students received an invitation last week from the Office of the Director of Human Rights, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion to complete a national survey of experiences of sexual violence and sexual harassment in the third level sector. The survey is being conducted by the Higher Education Authority (HEA) on behalf of Minister Simon Harris. Please take a moment to complete this survey here.

Here in UL, the University has established a Consent Framework Steering Committee <u>The</u> <u>Consent Framework | UL - Equality and Diversity</u> chaired by the Provost and consisting of senior UL staff members and Student Life Officers who are responsible for overseeing the implementation of the Framework and delivering on the Framework Action Plan. As part of this process, a Framework Policy Development Group has been established to oversee the review of existing Dignity & Respect Policies and develop a new Sexual Misconduct – Sexual Harassment Policy in line with the Framework.

On Friday, colleagues were invited to provide feedback on the key challenges currently being experienced as remote working continues. The purpose of the survey is to identify and address the challenges remote working is having on your career, your productivity levels and your physical and mental wellbeing in order to identify any equality, diversity and inclusion issues that need to be addressed by the University.
