#### **Return to Campus Updates**

The <u>New Academic Year Guide for Staff</u> on the COVID-19 SharePoint site has been updated once more. Specifically:

- Two additional Q&As have been added (5.8 & 5.9) to cover close contacts and managing a suspected case of COVID-19 on campus.
- **6.12** has been amended to detail what to do if a student refuses to wear a face covering in a teaching space.
- **Section 7**: Remote / Blended Working Equipment has been expanded to include how to order an office chair.

### **COVID-19 Management of Visitors, Guest Lecturers**

In accordance with the national Work Safely Protocol, the <u>COVID-19 Visitor Management Process</u> remains in operation. Departments/Units are advised that visitors should be limited to those who are business critical for University operations. Visitors in this instance are defined as non-UL staff members who are coming on campus for a short, once-off visit and who are accompanied by a UL staff member at all times.

A separate process is in place for guest lecturers or examiners who may be in charge of a teaching space while visiting UL and who may not be accompanied by a UL staff member during their time on campus or while teaching. Departments are required to contact <a href="https://nnsbookings@ul.ie">hnsbookings@ul.ie</a> to advise of the guest lecturer/examiner's upcoming visit. The latest revision of the COVID-19 Pre-Return to Work form will be issued to the department to be forwarded for completion by the guest lecturer/examiner. The guest lecturer/examiner will then be enrolled to complete the COVID-19 Staff Awareness training programme as appropriate. Departments are advised to forward a copy of the most recent version of the New Academic Year Guide for Staff to guest lecturers/examiners in advance of their arrival.

### Travel

The <u>COVID-19 International Travel Request</u> form has been updated slightly to take into account the change in the Department of Foreign Affairs travel advice. As always, this is a dynamic situation so the best approach with using forms and information sheets on the <u>COVID-19 SharePoint site</u> is to download as you need them to allow for updates.
