Run by the HSE, this will be open to staff and students with the aim of establishing the feasibility of implementing such testing at scale in education settings. ### **Return to Campus Working updates**

Most areas have submitted and had their Return-to-Work Business Response Plans approved. For those staff who continue to work remotely and who have not been included in an approved Business Response Plan, please note the following if you need to come on campus:

- Access for less than one hour – permitted/no approval required,
- Access for more than one hour – must obtain approval from Line Manager/Head of Department

Staff visiting the campus are reminded to continue to follow [Public Health guidance](#).

There have been reports of difficulties ensuring that enough Worker Representatives are trained and available in some parts of the campus. Please note that the training process has changed. An external company is no longer used in order to simplify and expediate the process. Once nominated by a Head of Department, the Health and Safety Authority Worker Lead Representative training link is circulated to the appointee. The appointee is also forwarded a list of the UL isolation rooms and information on management of a suspected COVID-19 case in UL.
