As mentioned last week, UL is taking part in a HSE led Rapid Antigen Diagnostic Test (RADT) pilot to establish the feasibility of the implantation of such testing at scale in education settings. We are looking for staff or student participants who are over 18 to take part. You will be asked to carry out antigen tests at home on 2 days per week (3 - 4 days apart) for 4 weeks and report your results to the HSE. UL will not have sight or access to your test results.

Please note that only staff or students with a valid @studentmail.ul.ie (students) or @ul.ie (staff) email address will be able to access the site.
