The President gave an update on the UL@50 Consultation Report and the development of UL's sustainability strategy, both of which are feeding into Executive Committee's considerations around the recalibration of the University's strategic plan. The aim is to launch the recalibrated plan in 2022. Andrea Deverell, Futures and Foresight Lead, and Professor Ann MacPhail, PESS, spoke about the ongoing work on transforming UL into a sustainable university.

Professor Mey also thanked staff for their work and contribution to campus life in 2021, and a video of selected UL highlights over the year was played during the event. Antigen Tests

Just over ten days ago Minister Simon Harris announced funding to make free antigen tests available to students. At very short notice, Student Life and the Postgraduate Students Union distributed over 1500 tests and face masks to students returning home to their family at Christmas. This would not have been possible without the collaboration and support of Buildings and Estates, Academic Registry, and the Office of the Provost.

Antigen tests will be made available to staff coming on-campus in the new year. The distribution process will be available in the <u>PPE Folder</u> on the COVID-19 SharePoint site.

COVID-19 Updates

Currently, the plan for returning to work after the Christmas break is to continue with our approach from mid-November. Specifically, this means that staff should work from home unless it is necessary to attend the campus in person. Please consult with your Line Manager regarding your own specific role. Face to face teaching and research is to continue as per Government guidance and it is necessary for staff engaged in this work to attend campus in person. If you work in a single occupancy office, then you may continue to work on-campus.

Meetings should remain online rather than in person.

UL will continue to monitor and follow all current public health guidance whilst doing everything we can to ensure that the health, safety and well-being of our campus community remains our priority. If there are any changes to the national guidelines that may impact on UL, we will keep you informed.

The <u>UL COVID-19 International Travel Request Approval Process</u> has been updated. Specifically, the purchase order for travel must not be approved by the Line Manager until the International COVID-19 Travel Request is approved. Staff must not purchase flights via credit card until they have received their International COVID-19 Travel Request approval email confirmation. In all cases, even when travel has been approved you should keep up to date with the latest travel advice from the <u>Department of Foreign Affairs</u>.

Campus Access

Access to University buildings will be restricted during the Christmas break and is subject to the process outlined in the <u>Building Access Control Procedure</u>.
