Dear all,

Along with the usual pressures on students and staff around exam time, there is a degree of additional apprehension about the current COVID-19 transmission levels in Ireland. A significant proportion of exams have been moved online. The Provost, Nigel Healey will be writing to all students on Monday to outline the preventative measures and supports being put in place for oncampus exams and in summary these are:

- Students will be advised not to attend on-campus exams if they are unwell or displaying symptoms of COVID-19.
- Exam spaces will be well ventilated.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at exam centre entrances
- Students will be required to wear face coverings.
- If a student feels more comfortable with a medical grade face covering (FFP2), they will be
 made available in advance of entering exam centres. These face coverings are also still
 available for staff to order using the PPE request form in the PPE Folder on the COVID-19
 SharePoint site.
- Exam desks will be set up at approx. 1m spacing.
- Ecostatic cleaning will take place weekly (in excess of the manufacturer recommended 1-month interval) in exam centres.
- Sanitising wipes will be available in all exam centres to facilitate self-cleaning.

Spaces continue to be available for students to study on campus and quiet rooms have been identified to facilitate those who need to take online exams on campus.

HR Learning & Development

Earlier this year, Learning and Development invited all University staff to participate in a training needs survey. Thanks to everyone who responded. From the survey, the key training needs identified were Leadership, Project Management Skills, Communication Skills and Career Development Support.

In response to these needs, here are just some of the courses which have run over the past few months: The Management Essentials Programme, Head of Department Training, Communicating your Research with Impact, Influencing Skills, Facilitating meetings, Difficult Conversations, the Principles of Project Management and Supporting Women in Academia.

We have also developed a new programme *Career Development for Support Staff* which has been very well received; 100% of respondents would recommend the programme to a colleague
