COVID-19 & PPE

If you test positive for COVID-19, you are asked to notify the University at COVID19Report@ul.ie as soon as possible with the date you were last on campus and when you were diagnosed. The information you provide will be received by the UL Health & Safety Unit who will use it to monitor the number of COVID-19 incidences within our community. It may be communicated to the HSE if required for reporting purposes and also to the Student Health Centre. Records will be deleted by UL after 30 days.

The latest advice from Public Health Mid-West to UL is that the most effective face covering for sustained and comfortable use is surgical masks. These are identified as *Disposable 3-ply Polypropylene face-mask* on the PPE Request Form in the Return to Campus Working section of the <u>COVID-19 SharePoint Hub</u>, and can be ordered by staff along with other items via your Department Head/ Faculty Manager/ Chief Technical Officer. FFP2 respirators are also available but there are specific requirements to wearing them and they are not comfortable for long-term use.

Communications

There was a very positive reaction in the local and national media to the launch of the Immersive Software Engineering (ISE) programme at UL a few weeks ago.
