Working in Ireland & Tuition Fees



WORKING IN IRELAND

Non-EU full time undergraduate/postgraduate students are allowed to work for 20 hours per week during their study period in Ireland. Students may work full time (40 hours per week) during the vacation period.

Before starting employment it is necessary to obtain a PPS number from the Social Welfare Office in Limerick.

Applicants will need to present the following documents in person, and fill out an application form. When your PPS number card is ready it will be posted to your Limerick address. Generally applications take 10 working days to process.

1. Passport + Immigration Card
2. Proof of address in Limerick (letter provided by the International Education Division)

TUITION FEES

Fees should be paid in Euro (€) directly to the Fees Office in accordance with the instructions on your offer letter. Please note that the acceptance fee you pay following your offer letter is deducted from your outstanding fee balance. **NB:** All tuition fees must be paid before 31st August 2016.

Non – EU On-Line Fee Payments (Preferred Payment Method)

The International Education Division is delighted to be able to offer Non- EU students the option of paying their tuition fees and accommodation expenses for full time programmes (undergraduate and postgraduate) on line. With no international bank transfer fees and a better exchange rate guaranteed it is the preferred method of payment. Who can use this system?

All students from Non-EU countries who wish to pay their tuition fees, medical insurance or accommodation fees for the 2016/7 academic year.

Benefits:

- Your student visa will be processed much faster
- You will save money on international bank charges
- You can track your payment online

How does it work?

1. Student makes a local bank transfer in his/her home country. This local payment takes 1 day. The student emails International Student Payment Service (ISPS) a copy of his Electronic Funds Transfer payment.

2. ISPS receive instant notification from the local bank and transfers the money into the University of Limerick bank account.

PROCEDURES FOR EXIT FROM UNIVERSITY OF LIMERICK AND PAYMENT OF REFUND

The date the Student Services Office at the University of Limerick receives a signed Student Exit Form, which must be handed in personally by the student in question, will be deemed to be the date the student leaves the university.

Subsequently, Student Services Office will liaise with the Fees Office and the International Education Division to arrange for the payment of the tuition refund.

In the case of international students holding a student visa for study in Ireland wishing to discontinue their studies in the University of Limerick, the International Education Division will inform the Irish immigration authorities of the impending change in the status of the students concerned as the student visa will no longer be valid once an international student exits the University of Limerick.

COST OF LIVING
