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## Admission procedures for foreign students coming to the ENSA-PB

<p><b>Years and programs</b></p>	<p>We recommend that students integrate the ENSA-PB at the beginning of the first semester in September. Students generally come for the third year of study (Bachelor's Degree) or the first year of the Master's degree, though it is also possible to come for the second year of study (Bachelor's Degree).</p> <p>Finally, students may come for the fifth year of study, in which case they are required to take courses in the Master 1 program.</p> <p>In all cases, students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered. Their course of study should be compatible with the structure of the ENSA-PB program in which they are enrolled.</p> <p><b>ENSA-PB will only accept students with at least an intermediate level in French (B1).</b></p>
<p><b>Application procedure</b></p>	<p>The ENSA-PB only accepts files sent <b>over e-mail</b> by the International Office of the student's home university. <b>The registration form must be sent by email with the required documents.</b> Portfolios are not necessary.</p> <p>A certificate of admission, a welcome guide and an academic calendar will be sent to the student.</p>

<p><b>Application deadline</b></p>	<p><b>The application deadline is May 15, 2016 for the first semester and November 2, 2016 for the second semester.</b></p>
<p><b>Language and language courses</b></p>	<p><b>All classes are taught in French.</b> A free course in French as a foreign language is organized by the ENSA-PB in September.</p>
<p><b>Academic calendar</b></p>	<p>The academic year, divided in two semesters, lasts 10 months. It runs from late September to mid-July, with a two-week break in December, a one-week break in February, and another two-week break in April.</p>
<p><b>Learning agreement (for Erasmus+ students only)</b></p>	<p>A draft version of the learning agreement for 2016-2017 will be established before the student arrives. For more information, we refer you to the guides for the Bachelor's (Licence) and the Master's degrees for 2015-2016. The guides for 2016-2017 will be available as courses are presented. The course of study plan will be finalized after the period of registration for courses.</p>
<p><b>Grading</b></p>	<p>The ENSA-PB uses the ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System). Student work is evaluated through letter-grades. <u>Student results are documented through a local grade.</u></p>
<p><b>Housing</b></p>	<p>The ENSA-PB is not located on a campus and does not have residence halls for student accommodation. It is the students' responsibility to make the necessary housing arrangements.</p>

<p><b>Health insurance and civil liability Insurance</b></p>	<p><b>Health insurance</b></p> <p>Ø Students who are European Union citizens should send a copy of their valid, up-to-date European social security card.</p> <p>Ø Students who are NOT European Union citizens will have to pay a contribution to the student social security system for an amount of approximately 215 euros.</p> <p>The school does not accept private health insurance.</p> <p><b>Civil liability Insurance</b></p> <p>Each student <u>is required</u> to have a civil liability insurance, which covers the damage s/he might cause to others.</p> <p>This insurance can be purchased in France at a cost of about 15 euros.</p>
