About the University	<p>Europa-Universität Flensburg is located in the city of Flensburg, at the border with Denmark. It was founded in 1994 and is the northernmost university in Germany. It offers mainly courses in education and other fields of social sciences.</p> <p>Among the special features includes the German-Danish study courses in cooperation with the University of Southern Denmark Sønderborg. Our modern campus site is provided with facilities which fulfil the highest technical and multimedia requirements. As part of this the university campus with its landscaped surroundings, refectory and lecture theatre complex are largely equipped with WLAN-access. This means that cordless internet access is possible from every location within the university. Europa-Universität Flensburg also offers a wide range of attractive leisure and sports activities. There is a fitness centre offering state-of-the-art equipment.</p>

Do students need to show a certain amount of funds to apply to your university? If so, how much and what information do you require?	For the University students do not need to show anything. However, they need to show the German government they have 735€ times the number of months they will be here in order to get the student visa. The proof of funds must be in one of these ways: 1) a blocked German account, 2) scholarship, or 3) a confirmation legalized at the consulate.
Number of credits that undergraduate students need to complete in one semester (please state both minimum and maximum load)	It is recommended that they take between 20 and 30 ECTS to maintain their full time student visa status, equivalent to 10-15 credits (circa).
Application procedure and requirements for Incoming Exchange Students To apply for an exchange study period at Europa-Universität Flensburg you need to be nominated officially by your International Office or coordinator. After the nomination you will receive an email with a link from us to start your online application. ACCOMMODATION	
<p>Is on-campus accommodation guaranteed for exchange students? Meal plan Options for on-campus accommodation?</p>	<p>The accommodations on campus are administered by a non-profit organization called Studentenwerk. The students must apply directly with them. The earlier the better the chance to obtain a room on Campus. There are no meal plans, since normally the students have only lunch at the</p>

	cafeteria. They usually live in share apartments with a common kitchen thus they will have breakfast and dinner at home.
Does the university assist students to find off-campus accommodation?	If the student was not able to get a room on Campus we will help to find an alternative place off campus.
VISA REQUIREMENTS	
Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa? Please provide what you will issue, letter, forms etc., for students to apply for a visa	Foreign students wishing to enter the Federal Republic of Germany require a entry visa for educational purposes (or student entry visa) issued by a diplomatic representation of the Federal Republic of Germany (embassy or consulate) in the student's country of origin and entered into the passport. This regulation does not apply to applicants from EU countries. Prospective students should inquire in detail at an early stage about the visa requirements. They are warned against entering Germany with a tourist visa. A tourist visa cannot be retrospectively converted into a student entry visa or residence permit for educational purposes. The entry visa is issued for three months only and must be converted into an electronic residence permit (eAT) at the Alien Department Office (<i>Ausländerbehörde</i>). Soon after arrival in Flensburg and at least 8 weeks before expiring you should request the eAT. The fee for the eAT is 100 €. EU students do not need an entry visa and an electronic residence permit (eAT).
How much does a student visa cost?	The resident permit costs 100€ and the extensions costs 80€
Are exchange students allowed to work and how many hours are they permitted to work?	International students from other countries are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half days per year.
Is a special visa required for work?	EU-nationals are permitted to work or to complete a period of practical placement in Germany without requiring obtaining a work permit. The residence permit for studies in Germany issued to Non-EU nationals does not include a work permit. These students are only permitted to work for a maximum of 120 full days or 240 half days per year. When they leave their countries they leave with a temporary visa which they need to extend as soon as they arrive in Germany. They can work once they have extended their visas.
MEDICAL INSURANCE	
Are exchange students able to apply for an insurance waiver if they have their own insurance coverage or are they required to purchase a compulsory plan? If yes please provide details and approximate cost?	In Germany, all students up to the age of 30 are subject to compulsory health insurance (currently € 92 monthly). If you are from a country that has concluded a bilateral social security agreement with Germany and if you have sufficient health insurance coverage in your home country, you will be exempted from the obligation of insuring yourself with a statutory health insurance scheme for the duration of your course of study in Germany. In order to get exemption, you must bring and submit your EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) or other proof of health insurance in your own country. The student can apply for a waiver here, if the insurance in Germany confirms that the student is well covered with their own insurance. However, all documents must be provided in English or German.



Estimated expenses for a semester

The German government requires to get the visa a proof that that the student has 720€ month multiplied by the numbers of months of the stay. However, Flensburg is not an expensive city in comparison to other German cities.
