Health insurance requirements and costs	Do you required students to have a health insurance? YES it's compulsory if you stay more than 3 months <b>AND</b> if you don't have the European card of health insurance. In this case, students <b>MUST</b> register with the Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie (CPAM-Ameli) / Social Security Student as soon as they have their school certificate at INSA: <a href="#">CPAM-Ameli</a> In addition, students <b>must subscribe</b> while being in their home country an <a href="#">International Medical Health Insurance (step 3)</a> translated into French or English. This insurance shall be valid: until the 1 <sup>st</sup> day of the month following his/her arrival (Ex: if he/she arrive on October 4 <sup>th</sup> , valid until November 1 <sup>st</sup> )
Accommodation	<b>If accepted at INSA Toulouse, students shall receive by email their Acceptance Letter AND the Accommodation Booking Form. Late Accommodation Booking Form will be refused.</b> <b>Within the deadline dates</b> indicated in our email and in accordance with the very limited number of accommodations, the International Office (DRI) <b>may manage</b> the booking of the accommodation with our 2 partners: CROUS and PROMOLOGIS. - CROUS rooms and studios coordinated by DRI: from 298€ to 370€ per month; - PROMOLOGIS studios coordinated by DRI: around 417€ to 450€ per month. If students prefer to live somewhere else, they shall <b>book it by themselves</b> . We provide information and a <a href="#">list of accommodations</a> to help them. Students can also contact the <a href="#">Toul'box service</a> to help them find an accommodation ("All-in" Package – 200€ in 2018/2019)
