Language requirements	High English proficiency for the English-taught courses (see “Modules” below for details). No Japanese language proficiency required (beginner courses available)
Immigration	After being admitted, it will be necessary to obtain a student visa before entering Japan. Nagoya University of Foreign Students will fill out their Certificate of Eligibility Application Forms (a visa-supporting document) and submit it to the International Office. NUFS will then apply for the certificates on the students’ behalf at the Nagoya Immigration Bureau but students will need to apply for the visa at their nearest Japanese Embassy/Consulate.

<p>Approximate cost of living per month</p>	<p>Exchange students from partner universities are eligible for scholarships: NUFSS scholarship (60,000 yen/month) or JASSO scholarship (80,000 yen/month; government-granted stipend, depends upon availability).</p> <p>Study abroad participants need to bring adequate funds to cover their personal expenses in Japan. Although such personal expenses vary from individual to individual, students should prepare approximately 100,000 yen per month in total (including accommodation charges).</p>
<p>Orientation</p>	<p>In an effect to facilitate students' acclimatization to life in Japan, the International Office staff will hold a Post-Arrival Orientation Session for new students. Assistance will be provided in obtaining a local bank account, etc.</p>
<p>Modules:</p>	<p>Nagoya University of Foreign Studies offers two types of courses for its study abroad program students:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Japan Studies Course: English-taught courses examining contemporary Japan in the context of Asian and Global Studies. 2) Japanese Language Course: offered in three different intensity degrees: introductory (absolute beginner, 2 classes/week), semi-intensive (6 different proficiency levels, 4 classes/week), intensive (elementary level, 8 classes/week). <p>Students are free to take courses of their choice – they can either register for English-taught courses only, Japanese language courses only, or a combination of both depending on their preferences and/or home university requirements.</p>
