Semester workload, full-time studies and grading system

Full-time study load is 30 ECTS credits per semester and 60 ECTS credits per academic year. The maximum study load per semester is 45 ECTS. For your reference: A 3-year Bachelor's Degree includes 180 credits and a 2-year Master's Degree includes 120 credits. Grades are issued according to the ECTS-scale.

Accommodation

Linköping University does not guarantee accommodation for all their incoming exchange students¹. We do, however, have a limited number of rooms that we offer exchange students on a first come, first served basis. Students apply for these rooms by using the same application form as for your courses. Application deadline is April 15 (for the autumn semester) and October 15 (for the spring semester), but the earlier one applies, the bigger the chance to get a room; early applications are recommended. The rooms are located in student corridors, with shared kitchens and within walking/biking distance from the University. They are furnished and have a monthly rent of approximately 3,000 SEK (~ €300).

If a student is not offered a room from the University, he/she will get instructions from the housing coordinator at Linköping University on how to search for accommodation on his/her own.
