<p>On Campus Accommodation</p>	<p>On-campus housing is available to undergraduate and graduate exchange students. You should apply for on-campus housing as soon as you receive your admittance packet.</p> <p>Most residence halls (often called "dorms") in the United States tend to be filled with freshman and sophomore students, though some junior, senior, and graduate students do live on-campus. <p>Off Campus Accommodation</p>	<p>Off-campus student housing is plentiful in Tucson! Many students live in student apartment complexes that offer a social atmosphere and a good way to meet American students. Other students choose to live in apartments that mix UA students with full-time Tucson residents. <p>Approximate cost of living per month</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Housing: Room in shared apartment or house (\$350-600/month) or on-campus residence hall (\$650-950/month) • Food: \$150-400/month • Books: \$250-600/semester • Additional costs could include Sun Tran Bus Pass or a bike, individual class fees, personal expenses, and other travel expenses
<p>Modules:</p>	<p>As an international exchange student, you must register for a minimum of 12 units</p> <p>Never drop below these minimums or you will fall "out-of-status" with immigration regulations & could risk visa problems, including losing your tuition waiver.
