Language requirements	All exchange students admitted to RHIT are required to possess sufficient language skills to successfully complete coursework. The home university officer states that the above student applicant demonstrates adequate English

	ability to successfully study at RHIT. In case of being unable to verify English ability, the RHIT Director of ESL can be a resource. Please refer to Exchange application for further information on language proficiency.

Insurance requirements for incoming exchange students	All exchange students on a J-1 visa are required to purchase the Rose-Hulman health insurance plan even if they are required to purchase their home country insurance. This insurance meets US government requirements. NO exceptions can be made to this rule. The fee for the policy will be billed directly to the student account. This policy covers the student if they travel throughout the USA during their quarter. Students who have insurance issued for spring quarter will have automatic coverage at no additional charge until August 25 while remaining in the USA. Note: Students should purchase insurance on their own that meets US government requirements since RHIT's insurance is not valid until the start
Health Documents	of the quarter in which the student studies.All students are required to show proof of the following mandatory immunizations: tetanus vaccine booster dose within past ten years, two MMR or measles vaccine, meningococcal vaccine and completed polio series. Exchange students should NOT get their Tuberculosis screening done until they arrive on campus.
Immigration	All incoming exchange students will need a visa to study in the United States. Once the student has shown English Proficiency, and has been accepted to study at Rose-Hulman, the Office of Global Programs will issue a DS-2019 document and mail it to the home school advisor. This document is to be used to secure a J-1 visa.
Laptop	Each exchange student is required to rent a Rose-Hulman loaner laptop for a fee of \$200.00 per quarter.
On Campus Accommodation	On-campus accommodation is available for undergraduate exchange students. Students should note that all rooms are shared with another student of the same gender.
Approximate cost of living per academic term	Exchange students are required to show a minimum of \$6,600 per academic term for expenses. These estimated expenses include, but are not limited to, on-campus housing, meal plan, mandatory medical insurance, laptop rental, student fees, textbook purchase and/or rental, and personal spending money.

You have two times for pick up by our pre-arranged shuttle, at 01:00 pm DST or at 06:00 pm DST.
If you choose a different arrival time, it is your responsibility to secure transportation to campus. Keep in mind it is about an hour from the airport to our campus.
