





#### Northern Arizona University


#### MBA Program

#### > Dr. Paul Keim

Dr. Paul Keim, Regents' Professor of Biology at Northern Arizona University, is a world-famous researcher in infectious diseases. As director of the Pathogen Genomics Division at TGen, the Translational Genomics Research Institution, Dr. Keim and his significant discoveries in anthrax played a crucial role in aiding the United States military and intelligence community in investigations. He also applied similar genetic tracking techniques to contribute to the relief efforts of Haiti's 2010 earthquake, when a cholera outbreak killed 6,000 people. As a member and former chair of the U.S. National Science Advisory Board for Biosecurity, Keim works with other experts in infectious diseases, biology, biosafety, public health, national security, and law enforcement to analyze the risks and benefits of biological research being conducted by private ventures.

> Dr. Paul Wiener, EdD, MBA, CHA



Dr. Wiener is an associate professor at SHRM and is active in the state restaurant and lodging associations, and is also engaged in consulting for hotel acquisitions and economic impacts of tourism. Dr. Wiener also works with the National Parks Service (NPS) as the administrator of SHRM's training program for NPS concession specialists. Prior to teaching, Dr. Wiener spent 23 years in restaurant and lodging operations. He owned and operated a property management and consulting firm, served as general manager of

resort properties in Utah and Colorado, and worked abroad for Sheraton and as a senior consultant in Pannell Kerr Forster's London office. He worked in Nevada casino hotels for five years, and earned a B. Sc. from UNLV's College of Hotel Administration. He has an AB in Political Science from Claremont McKenna College, an MBA from Harvard University, and a doctorate in Educational Leadership from NAU.

Dr. Cathy Small, professor at NAU College of Social and Behavioral Sciences, is a cultural anthropologist and ethnographer. Her popular book "My Freshman Year," is published in multiple languages including Chinese and Korean and featured in public and professional media (including The New York Times, USA Today, and CNN).

Dr. Small is a recipient of the national Praxis Award in Applied Anthropology, and was honored with the Points of Light award from Presidents

Clinton and Bush Sr. for co-founding a mentoring program for low-income youth. Dr. Small has been the SBS Teacher of the Year, and piloted the innovative ANT 215 course "Connecting Across Cultures," which by design is half international students and half U.S. nationals. The learning is both social and academic, both inside and outside of the classroom, and both international and U.S. students call the interactive experience "unforgettable."

Dr. Fredericka Stoller is an internationally published author of textbooks in the field of Second Language Acquisition. Dr. Douglas Biber also currently serves as Regents' professor of Applied Linguistics in CAL's English



department. Like Dr. Grabe and Dr. Stoller, he is an internationally-respected linguist who has often been invited to top-ranking universities for seminars and presentations. Professor Biber and Professor William Grabe (also from CAL's English department) are both members of AAAL.


#### Student Resources

Cline Library - More than 900,000 volumes, including over 460,000 books and over 180,000 e-books; access to over 135 databases and to articles in over 63,000 e-journals and newspapers; open 108.5 hours per week, including until 2 a.m. five nights a week and extended hours (24-hour days) during End of Term and Finals weeks.

Student Learning Centers (SLCs) - provide personalized peer support such as Tutoring and Supplemental Instruction services for students to build confidence, cultivate independent learning and foster collaborative connections within the community.


Student Organizations - sports, chess, music, and technology... join one of more than 300 student clubs and organizations to share your interests, develop your leadership skills and enhance your resume!

Health and Learning Center (HLC) - was built with a budget of \$180 million and opened its doors in Fall 2011. The 25,000 square meter building integrates recreation, health services, athletics and academics to engage students in holistic learning. Functional areas include indoor jogging track, 12-meter climbing wall, expanded weight room, multipurpose gym and Cardio Theater. The medical center and the counseling center promote and ensure physical and mental wellness among students on campus.



#### Campus Housing

Northern Arizona University offers a variety of living styles in 21 residence halls for students to choose from, combining the right amount of comfort, fun, and academic support. The Freshman Connections halls offer a supportive living and learning environment as students transition in their first year of college. Each residence hall is equipped with shared full-sized kitchen, multiple bathrooms with 24-hour hot water, laundry rooms, study rooms and high-speed internet. Residential Learning Communities allow students to live with others who share the same academic majors or special interests, and help them build strong connections with their peers, the faculty and staff. Fully-furnished apartment-style halls are available for junior and senior students. Each apartment is equipped with a kitchen, a stackable washer/dryer, a couch, a table and chairs. There are also extra amenities such as gyms and clubhouses in this type of housing.



Since its founding in 2012 by the Center for International Education, the International House (I-House) community has been home to hundreds of students from around the world. Over 40 countries have had student representation in the I-House, and over 22 primary languages have been spoken within the community. The International House gives a truly global experience to any student who lives in the community where international students and American students are assigned to the same room based on their stated interests and lifestyles. Students can learn about new cultures, practice foreign languages with native speakers, participate in unique events that foster cross-cultural understanding and build friendships with students from around the world.





#### Campus Dining

With 29 restaurants across campus, including late-night options, students at NAU are offered a variety of choices to eat on campus with tax-free meal plans and dining dollars.







#### Diversity

The mission of NAU Campus Dining is to provide nutritious, healthy and delicious food at a convenient time and location. Dining options include all-you-can-eat restaurants such as the Hot Spot and the DuBois Center, as well as retail dining such as Starbucks, Mexican Grill, Pasta Works, etc. In addition, several locations have incorporated cuisines that cater to international students. For example, Star Ginger offers Thai-Vietnamese inspired cuisine including rice bowls, pho soup and stir-fried meat and vegetables.

#### Nutrition and Wellness

Campus Dining works closely with a certified dietitian to ensure students have a wide selection of fresh, healthy, and balanced menu items to choose from. Additionally, a variety of menu options is provided for students with food allergies or other specific dietary needs.

#### Sustainability

From purchasing local, seasonal produce whenever possible to reducing inorganic and organic waste, the NAU Campus Dining team is dedicated to providing students with an exceptional dining experience that is good for humans and the planet. Campus Dining sources local produce from Arizona growers whenever possible. Some of the local farms that supply our foods include: Sunizona Family Farm (Willcox, AZ), D'Arrigo Farms (Yuma, AZ).

#### Center for International Education

The Center for International Education (CIE) is committed to the internationalization of the campus and curriculum. The CIE works diligently to provide opportunities that train students to be globally competent citizens. It serves over 1200 students from more than 71 countries and offers extensive support to NAU students and faculty seeking study/research abroad opportunities. There are certified international advisers at the Center, providing services to students, scholars and faculty on immigration, advising, campus activities, scholarships and more. As a result of CIE's effort, NAU received the 2012 Paul Simon Award for Comprehensive Internationalization. We are proud of this national recognition and we are even more committed to serving as a model for leadership in international education.

Students without proof of English proficiency are eligible. Conditionally-admitted applicants will be required to take the English Level Placement Test upon arriving, or enroll in NAU's Program in Intensive English (PIE) until passing the English Proficiency requirement.
