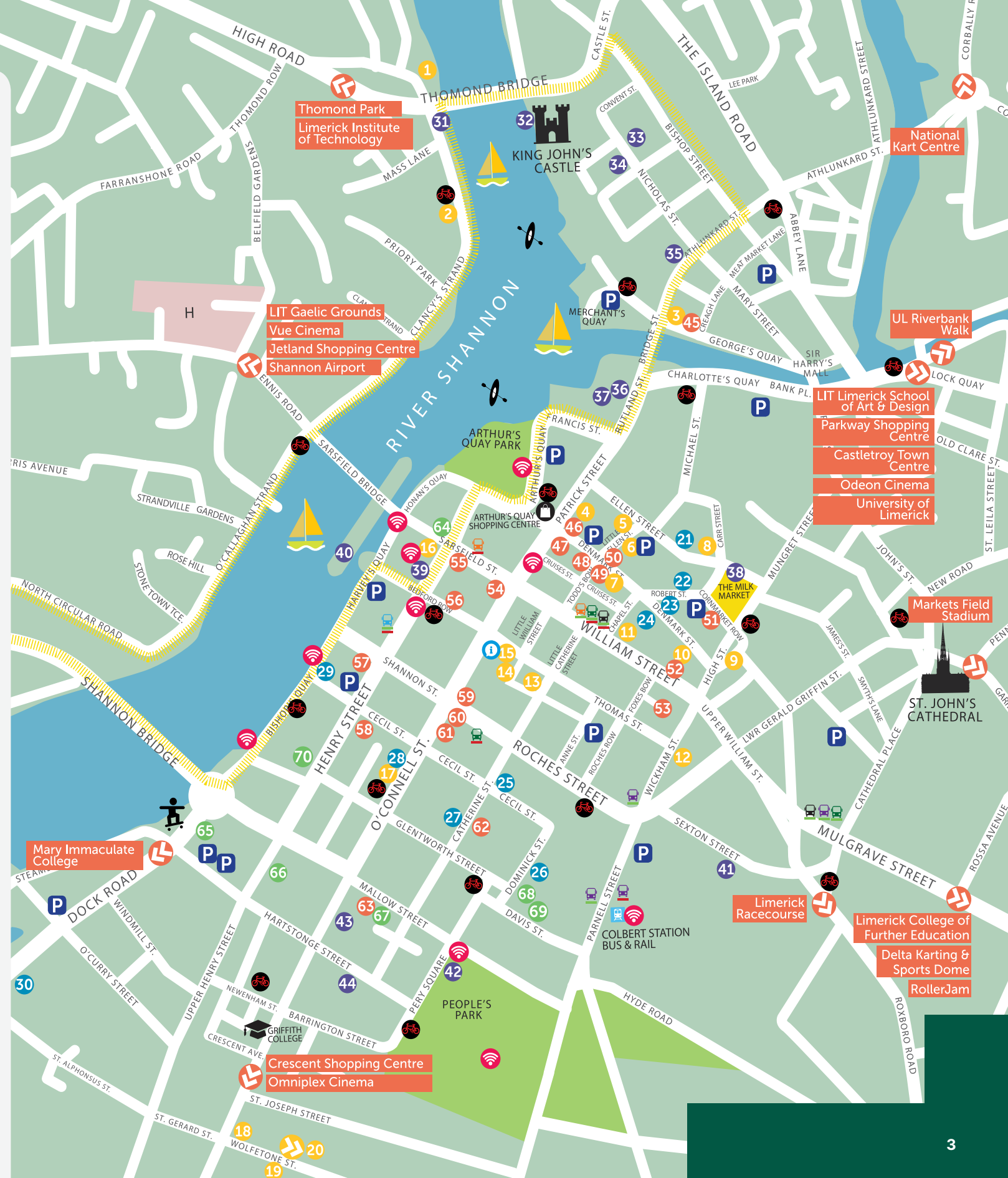

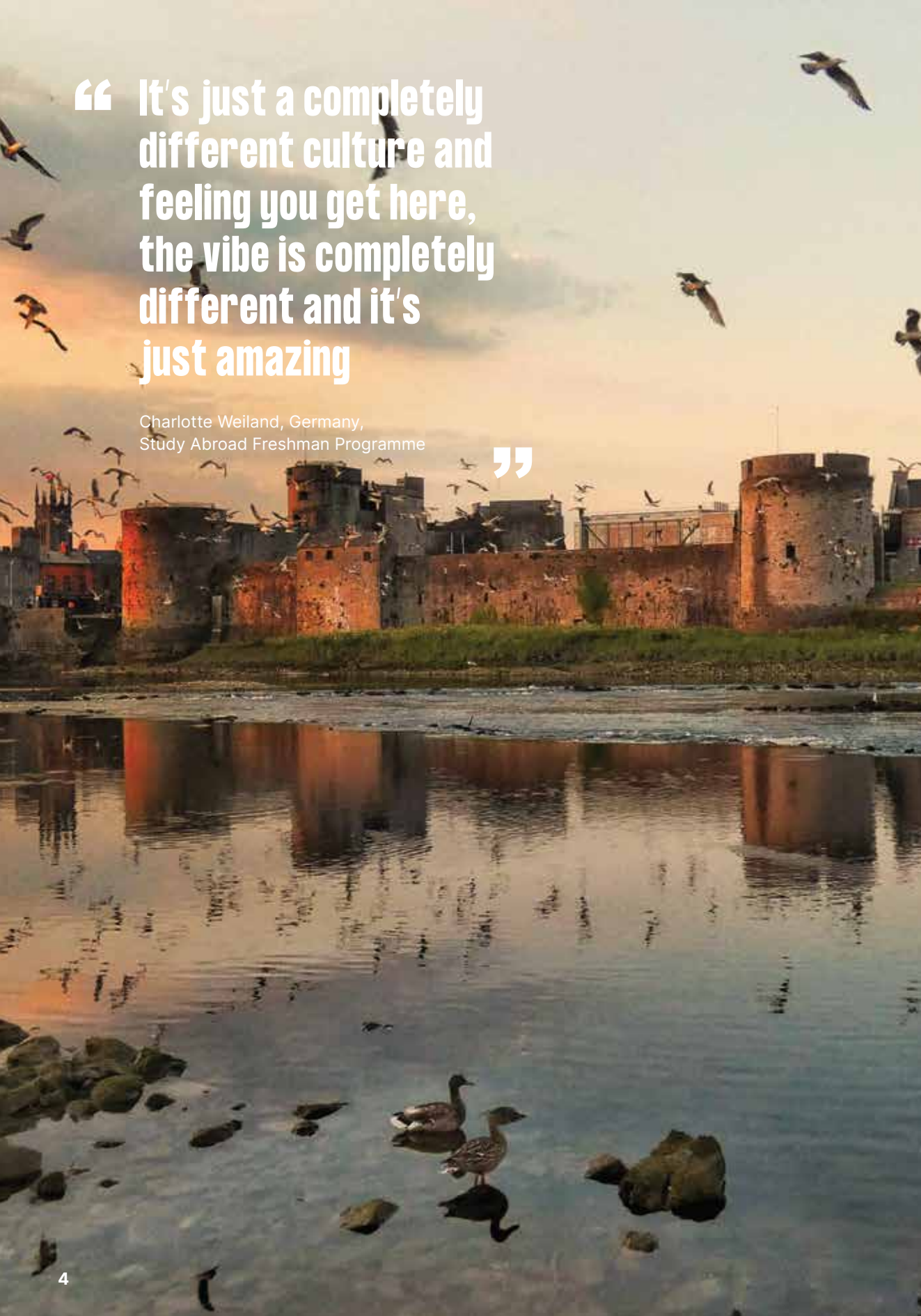

Location

Limerick is located in the South West of Ireland, boasting some of the best connections across Ireland and beyond to Europe, the USA and the rest of the world. Limerick is the gateway to the Wild Atlantic Way.

Shannon International Airport is just 25 minutes from Limerick city centre and has routes all over Europe and North America. There are also direct flights to the worldwide connection hub at Heathrow Airport.

Limerick is served with excellent rail links, with frequent services between Limerick and Dublin and other key urban centres. There are also extensive bus services to Limerick from all parts of Ireland.

From the University of Limerick, the bus will bring you into the city centre within 15 minutes, students can also rent bikes from student villages or the Coca Cola bike rental scheme, with stations all over the city.

During the day Limerick City is alive with the hustle and bustle of people going to work but also with people visiting the different shops around the city, from high street fashion to boutiques, Limerick has it all.

At the weekends you'll find Limerick City wakes up early, to stroll the stalls of Limerick's famous Milk Market, where you can find anything from artisanal products, fresh fruit and vegetables to a great cup of coffee. It is not to be missed.

Limerick by night There is as much to do in Limerick at night, as there is during the day. As with every city there is a wealth of bars and nightclubs to visit.



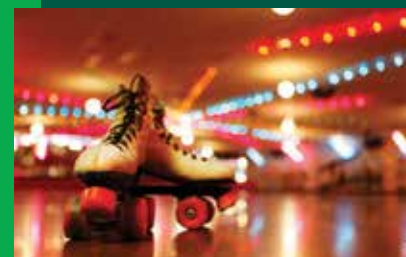
Escape Limerick:

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Where you’ll be living

UL students can choose to live on campus in one of the seven student villages, or off campus, in private student accommodation or self-catering houses and apartments.

Why the University of Limerick?

Voted the happiest campus in the world by international students in the 2019 International Student Barometer. 97% of graduates are in employment or further education within 6 months. UL students enter the job market with a competitive edge due to the largest internship program in Europe.

All international students are eligible for up to a two year working visa on completion of their degree. Choose UL for world class facilities, affordable education and world of opportunity.

Working while studying

If you are interested in working while studying, we have plenty of opportunities

for you! International students that hold an immigration stamp 2 are permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during the university term. During the holiday period students can work on a full time basis – up to 40 hours per week.

Job Opportunities in Limerick

Limerick is a hot-spot for job opportunities because it’s an attractive hub for international companies looking to establish or broaden their presence in Europe. Limerick is ranked 6th in the “top metropolitan areas of Western Europe to invest in,” these rankings were determined based on statistics related to capital investment, job creation, business costs, and economic strength.

International companies, and technology companies in particular, are also drawn to Limerick because of its location and large talent pool. The city is home to three prestigious third level academic institutions, producing thousands of employable graduates and an environment bustling with young professionals.

Limerick is home to companies such as Dell, Analog Devices, Regeneron, Johnson & Johnson, Zimmer, Stryker, Intel and Cook Medical. New patterns of employment are also emerging across new sectors – with companies like KEMP Technologies and ACMS Group expanding at a rapid rate. Northern Trust also has a very significant presence in Limerick.

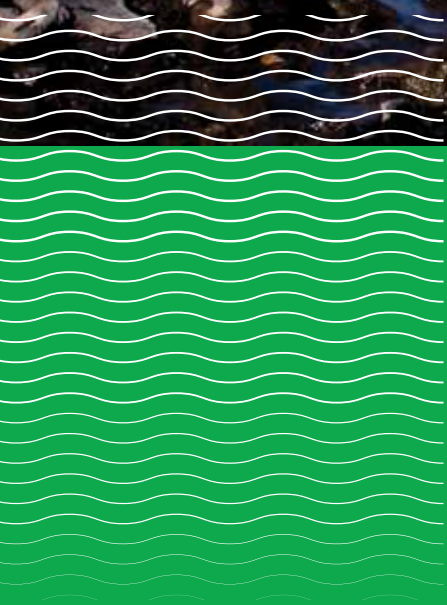
