Language graduates get good jobs as, by studying a language, you acquire a whole range of skills that can be applied to a great variety of professions.

In particular, you will have very good communication skills, which are highly valued by employers. Learning a language gives you another way of looking at, analysing and interpreting the world, so you are automatically more attractive to potential employers.

As a result, language graduates can choose from a variety of careers and professions, for example (non-exhaustive list):

- Teaching (not just second-level, but also professional language training);
- Tourism;
- International Business (Marketing, Finance, Personnel);
