





**Eligible international students can apply for a post-study work stream visa (temporary graduate visa, subclass 485). This visa is usually between 2 and 4 years, depending on your qualification (Hong Kong passport holders may stay for 5 years). Perth's category 2 regional status means that eligible international students who studied and graduated from Murdoch, and lived in Perth whilst holding their post-study work stream visa can apply for a second post-study work stream visa to stay for an additional 1 year.*

Western Australia is the ideal destination for both tourists and students and is the perfect place to begin your Aussie adventure.

MARGARET RIVER AND THE SOUTH WEST

Ranked as the Lonely Planet's number one destination in the Asia Pacific region, the area is a natural playground with pristine forests, beaches and world-class restaurants and wineries.

SHARK BAY AND MONKEY MIA

Famous for its wild dolphin experience, Monkey Mia is surrounded by rusty red sand dunes, white sandy beaches and water teeming with sealife. With blue skies and sunshine almost every day of the year, Monkey Mia and Shark Bay are ideal destinations for you to sit back and relax.

THE PINK LAKES (HUTT LAGOON)

The pink lake that has to be seen to be believed, Hutt Lagoon covers a whopping 70 square kilometres and tends to be at its pinkest in the mornings, changing character and colour according to the weather and the seasons.

NINGALOO REEF

More easily accessible than the Great Barrier Reef, and home to as many as 500 species of tropical fish and coral, the Ningaloo Reef spans 260 kilometres in length and runs alongside white sandy beaches and turquoise waters. Teeming with marine animals such as turtles, manta rays, dolphins and humpback whales, the Ningaloo Reef is also home to the migratory gentle giant, the whale shark.

BROOME

Broome is a beach resort town in Western Australia's Kimberley region. Along the Indian Ocean coastline, the white sands of 22km-long Cable Beach offer a dramatic backdrop for sunset camel rides. Nearby, dinosaur

tracks are revealed during low tide, while Roebuck Bay provides visitors with a chance to explore Broome's famous pearl farms.

KARIJINI

With over two billion years of the earth's natural history lying in wait, Karijini has been largely untouched by humankind and offers a pristine and unique look into Western Australia's heartland. In this remote location, you will get to descend into ancient gorges, scale some of the oldest rocks on the planet, paddle in crystal-clear waterways and cool off with a swim beneath the various cascading waterfalls.



Our nationally renowned Bayer Pilot Plant is where our Electrical Engineering students learn real-world skills. This engineer's playground is one of only a few in Australia and the only one of its kind in Western Australia.

IT INNOVATION HUB

Fitted out with the latest mixed and augmented reality equipment, industry-scale data centre and high-performance computing capabilities, our IT Innovation Hub is a cutting-edge teaching, learning and research facility, specially designed for IT students.

LAUNCHPAD

Launchpad is a place for students and industry to come together to solve challenges, create opportunities, take advantage of cutting-edge facilities such as 3D printers and collaboration spaces, and get professional consulting advice.

SPORTS SCIENCE FACILITY

Our sports science facility houses a dedicated exercise physiology laboratory, complete with a climate and altitude chamber, plus a performance laboratory with motion capture system and running track. It also includes a rehabilitation, strength and conditioning laboratory, complete with fully equipped gym with Olympic lifting facilities. It is also home to a Mind and Body Lab with a fitness testing area and a DEXA machine.

In our Herbert Smith Freehills Moot Court, you will have the opportunity to try hypothetical cases in a courtroom environment, develop advocacy and mooting skills, and compete against other law schools from around the world.

As a Creative Arts or Communications student, you'll get to experience our sound stage, television and radio studios, digital post-production facilities, sound-mixing studios, digital and creation workplaces, and professional video and editing suites.

THE VILLAGE

If you want to be in the centre of all the on-campus action, you cannot go past life at the Murdoch University Village. The Village has stylish, fully furnished apartments available for rent, with options to suit almost any budget. The Village offers a range of facilities, including:

OFF-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

Share houses

Like many students, you may wish to share a house with other students in a local Perth suburb, or you may choose privately rented accommodation. Depending on your lifestyle, you may choose to rent a single room from a house that is occupied by several other people or, alternatively, you can take on an entire lease for a single property yourself.

In a share house, you will have your own room, but amenities such as kitchens and bathrooms will generally be shared with your housemates. Students living together in shared accommodation will often have rules for inviting guests over. They will share the payment of utilities and the usage and clean-up of common areas. Shared accommodation is a great option if you're not wanting to live by yourself and are wanting to make friends with both local and international students and non-students.

Calculating your total cost of study

Your total cost of studying in Australia will include:

- Tuition fees
- Visa application fees
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- Flights
- Cost of living
- Other personal expenses
- Books and university expenses (Student Services and Administration Fees)

As a general guide, you should budget approximately AU\$500 per week for your living expenses in Perth as a single, or AU\$900 for a family of four.

STUDY THE NEW BACHELOR OF COMMERCE

CONFIRMATION OF ENROLMENT (CoE)

Once Murdoch has received your Acceptance of Offer documents and payable deposit, we will issue you an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), which then allows you to begin your visa application process through the Department of Home Affairs.

ORGANISING YOUR STUDENT VISA

All international students require a valid visa in order to study in Australia. You can apply for your student visa by either visiting the Department of Home Affairs website, or with the assistance of your agent.

In addition to your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), you may be required to provide other documentation as part of your visa application, including financial, health insurance, and language skills evidence.

Please note, if you are under the age of 18, the Australian Government requires additional documents in regard to accommodation, support and welfare arrangements, before the University will be able to accept you into the course and issue you with a CoE.

GET STARTED

Once your acceptance is processed, you'll be able to activate your student account, using the Murdoch Student Number in your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).

Your student number is your Murdoch identification, and is used as your username to log in to the Murdoch website. After activating your student account and creating a password, you'll be able to enrol in units and choose your timetable.


