



Masters in School Leadership

The University of Limerick School of Education has developed the Master of Education in School Leadership (MESL) to empower educational leaders in their career and across their lifespan. Students will learn the importance of evidence-based decision making and the role of effective educational leadership research in that process. Students will conduct their own research on a topic relevant to educational leadership. On completion of the programme, students will be awarded their Master of Education in School Leadership. This programme is delivered through blended learning, predominantly involving online/distance learning and occasional in-person meetings.






Key features of the programme include:

- Predominantly online and flexible delivery to cater for work-life balance.
- Students will conduct their own educational leadership research projects under expert supervision.
- Regular feedback and supervisor interaction.

Programme Structure	
Spring Semester	January – May <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Advanced Research Methods Module - Student Research - Thesis Writing
Summer Semester	May-August <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student Research - Thesis Writing
Autumn Semester	May – Mid-November <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student Research - Thesis Writing - Thesis Submission mid-November

Course Learning Outcomes

On completing this course, students will have:

- Engaged critically and analytically with an area of research relevant to school leadership.
 - Designed and conducted scientific inquiry into an aspect of educational leadership.
 - Appraised the practical and academic debates which pertain to educational leadership.
 - Developed an advanced and integrated practical and theoretical understanding of educational leadership.
 - Developed cognitive and technical research skills and be able to research and apply established theories to research in educational leadership.
 - Developed an ability to analyse critically, to reflect upon and to synthesise complex information, problems, concepts, and theories.
 - Demonstrated a clear understanding of the complexity of educational leadership.
 - Utilised research databases and accessed policy documentation to have comprehensive understanding of policy in educational leadership at both national and international levels.
 - Demonstrated intellectual autonomy in the development and dissemination of research.

How you will be taught

Students will be paired with an expert in educational leadership to guide them in their research journeys from the outset and throughout. In the Spring semester, student will complete an Advanced Research Methods module which will be delivered online and consist of both asynchronous and live sessions. This pass/fail module will equip students with the knowledge and capabilities necessary for the completion of their research projects.

Students will be expected to identify a research question, design and develop a research strategy, and lead their research project from start to finish. Students can expect a minimum of five meetings with their supervisor throughout the duration of their research projects to assist them in their research, however, the responsibility for completion of the research project and thesis lies with the student.

Entry Requirements

- Students are required to have a minimum 2.2 in the Postgraduate Diploma in School Leadership (or equivalent).
- Students are expected to have a minimum of 2 years teaching experience.
- The applicant must meet the University's Minimum English Language Requirements for Taught Post Graduate Programmes

Additionally, prospective students should provide an overview of the Educational Leadership Topic/Area (max. 500 words) that they would like to research.

*The University reserves the right to interview an applicant to determine their suitability to undertake the programme of study.
