

Academic Term Dates

Fall Term, September – December 2023Orientation: September 5Classes:September 6 – December 1Exams:December 4 - 18

Spring Term, January – April 2024Orientation: within the week of Jan 8-12Classes:January 9 – April 5Exams:April 8 - 26

Attendance at orientation is mandatory. Each term consists of 13 weeks of classes followed by a formal examination period of approximately two weeks during which there are no classes.

Application Process

- 1) Apply to your home university for an exchange at UVic Law. They will select students based on the criteria set out within the exchange agreements between the two institutions.
- 2) Your home university will advise us of their nominations.
- 3) We will contact nominees by email with instructions on how to apply to the UVic law exchange program.

Application Deadline

May 1st is our deadline for submission of applications for both terms. If you cannot meet this deadline, please contact us.

Course Information

All courses are instructed in English. Language Netlink ID Before you can be registered for courses, you must activate your Netlink ID. This also gives you access to your UVic email, on-campus Wi-Fi, and your academic records. Course A full list of courses and their pre- and co-requisites is available in the academic calendar. Selection Exchange students are eligible to take 300-level law courses. Please see Course Registration and Timetables for course offerings in specific terms, timetables, and Preliminary Course Information Summaries. Also refer to the Incoming Exchange Student Course Restrictions and Cautions document. Exchange students are eligible to take a maximum of one UVic course outside of UVic Law, with permission from your home institution and the UVic Associate Dean of Academic and Student Relations **Course Credits** Courses are valued in terms of units and vary between 1.0-2.0 units each. A 1.0 unit course meets 2 hours per week, a 1.5 unit course meets 3 hours per week, and a 2.0 unit course meets 4 hours per week. One hour of class time requires approximately 1-2 hours of additional study or reading. Course Load Full-time study requirements for domestic students is 7.0-8.5 units per term. This is a very heavy workload and is not expected of exchange students. Approval for your course load while at UVic is decided by your home university. Your course selection must be approved by your home institution and by the Associate Dean, Registration Academic and Student Relations. All registration changes must be approved by both universities and updates will be completed by UVic Law staff.

Additional Information

Study Visa	You must obtain a <u>study permit</u> if you intend to study and live in Canada for more than six months. If you are coming to Canada for one term only (four months), you do not require a permit. However, we do recommend that you get one in case you want to extend your stay or work on campus. You may need a <u>temporary resident visa</u> to enter Canada from certain countries. For students coming from visa-exempt nations, there is a new <u>entry requirement</u> to be aware of and complete.
Housing	You are responsible for making your own accommodation arrangements. If you are interested in campus housing, apply directly to <u>Residence Services</u> as soon as possible. Campus housing is in extremely high demand. Residence Services also provides a listing of <u>off-campus housing</u> and if English is your second language, you may be eligible for the <u>Homestay Program</u> .
Health Insurance	The cost of medical treatment in Canada is extremely high if you are not covered by insurance, Exchange students are required to have coverage through the <u>"guard.me@UVic" plan</u> .
Fees	Although tuition fees are paid to your home university, you will still be responsible for student fees such as textbooks, course materials, and the photocopy fee. Exchange students may opt in to the UPass (transit pass), Athletics and Recreation, and the University of Victoria Students' Society (UVSS) Extended Health Plan.
Orientation	On the first day of fall term, there is a mandatory orientation for new upper year students including visiting and exchange students. There are also optional orientation activities hosted by the <u>Law Students' Society</u> and the <u>University</u> .
