Location

The UCLouvain Saint-Louis Bruxelles campus is located in the heart of Brussels. Its urban campus is made up of various buildings spread over two sites :

- Rue d'Arlon site : for the Faculty of Translation and Interpreting located near the European Institutions ;
- Botanique site : consisting of the Boulevard du Jardin botanique building, the rue du Marais buildings and the rue de l'Ommegang buildings for the three other Faculties.

Application procedure

1 Nomination

Students who wish to study at UCLouvain Saint-Louis Bruxelles must be nominated by their home university via Mobility Online during the nomination period.

The link has been sent to all contact person.



Once nominated, students receive by email a link to complete a profile.

Documents to download online :

- Electronic photo
- Transcript of records (marks of courses obtained before the exchange period)
- Copy of ID or passport
- Learning agreement
- Language certificate (OLS result or certificate from issued by the home university or TOEFL-IELTS-DELF-DALF)
- Copy of the European health insurance or international health insurance contract

Academic information

1 Learning agreement

A learning agreement with the course selection as well as the number of credits needs to be filled and signed by the student, the home institution and UCLouvain Saint-Louis Bruxelles before the exchange period starts.

The Learning Agreement needs to be uploaded on Mobility Online.

2 Courses catalogue

The course catalogue for the bachelor program is available <u>here</u>.

3 ECTS system

All study programs at UCLouvain Saint-Louis Bruxelles are measured in terms of ECTS credits. Bachelor programs count 180 ECTS credits and one year count 60 ECTS credits.

4 Retake exam session

The retake session for the January and June exams session will automatically take place in August. The Erasmus+ students will have to come back to Brussels for the retake session. We may consider exams in distance-mode for students coming from non-EU institutions.

Students who fail an exam in January or June should be aware that the new transcript of records for the retake session will not be issued until early October.

2 Intensive French week

Before the beginning of each semester, we organize an intensive French week of 4 or 5 halfdays (according to the semester). Groups are created for intermediate-beginner to advanced levels. Complete beginners are invited to take the French as a foreign language course during the semester. The student's level is defined by the result of an online placement test.

It is necessary to register. The registration form will be sent by e-mail to all nominated students.

3 Language of instruction

For the Faculty of Translation and Interpreting, all the courses are taught in French. Language and translation courses are given in French and/or in a foreign language.

For the other Faculties, most courses are taught in French. However, several courses and seminars are taught in Dutch or in English.



4 French for exchange students

The French for exchange students course aims to help students learn French more effectively by giving them the tools they need to take advantage of their stay in a French-speaking environment. Beyond the purely linguistic dimension, the course also aims to be an introduction to Belgian culture.

Following the knowledge test, students are placed in one of the following groups : beginner, intermediate-beginner, intermediate-advanced or advanced.

Each level is worth 5 ECTS/semester provided that the student is present, participates in the courses and completes the required work. A maximum of 3 unexcused absences are allowed. Students who follow the course all the year and who pass 2 levels will receive 10 ECTS.

You may simply write the code FLE on the Learning Agreement to register.

Welcome week

September

An introduction to Belgian culture is organized over a week in order to give incoming students a taste of their host city and country. The program consists of conferences in the morning and associated visits in the afternoon (waffle workshop, the Belgian Parliament, brewery visits, ...)

The number of students is limited to 80 students in order to make the visits accessible to everyone. Normally the whole week is organized in English but we could foresee a few activities in French if we receive enough registrations.

January

An introduction to Belgian culture week is also organized end of January but parallel to the intensive French week. Students can participate in both, as the FLE course takes place in the morning and the cultural activities in the afternoon.

Visa

For citizens from an EU country

They must be in possession of an identity card or passport valid at least until the end of their exchange period.

For citizens from a non-EU country

They must personally apply for a temporary residence permit for study purposes in order to obtain a study visa (type D visa).

For citizens from a non-EU country whose institution is a member of the EU

The students must contact the responsible person for incoming students to obtain the appendix 33

Insurances

All students who wish to participate in an exchange program are asked to take out several types of insurances.

Compulsory insurances :

• Health care insurance :

For students from a non-EU country

They must be in good standing and have taken out a policy with their mutual insurance company or private insurance company that covers health care (medical consultations and purchase of medication), dental expenses, hospitalization expenses (in case of emergency or following an accident), and repatriation expenses.

For students from an EU country

They must be in possession of the European Health Insurance Card (blue card) at least valid till the end of the exchange period. This card proves that they are in good standing with their mutual insurance company and enables them, in particular, to benefit from reduced health care costs.

Recommended insurances :

- Insurance against theft
- Travel insurance, particulary for loss or theft of luggage
- Civil liability insurance must cover the student for damage caused to people, goods or property outside the activities organized at the university or by the university.

Accomodation

Our residence called « l'Ommegang » is available for exchange students. The prices vary from 481€/month to 713€/month depending on the size of the room, services and facilities. It is very important to book a room well in advance, as soon as the nomination has been sent. Rooms are allocated on the system « first come, first served »

Reservation procedure :

- Accomodation application form to be completed online by the student
- An e-mail is send to the student with a room proposal and a rental agreement
- Payment of the guarantee (confirmation of the reservation)
- Upon arrival : handing over of the keys, checking the initial state of the room, ...
