VISA INFORMATION	Non EU students coming to SKEMA in France for more than 3 months need a long-stay student visa. Once in France, students will be required to validate their visas. The International Office team will explain this procedure to students during Orientation. International students studying in Raleigh, Suzhou, Belo Horizonte or Cape Town-Stellenbosch will also be assisted to prepare their student visas. SKEMA CAMPUSES GENERAL INFORMATION



SOPHIA ANTIPOLIS - France

General background: The Sophia Antipolis campus is located on the French Riviera in Sophia Antipolis, a technology park which is home to several renowned companies, research institutes and schools of higher education. Most of SKEMA's students live either in Antibes or Juan les Pins, coastal towns close to Sophia Antipolis, easily accessible by bus.

Food: Lunch can be bought at the cafeteria for €3.25 from Monday to Friday. Sandwiches and salad bar are also available as well as microwave ovens for students' use.

Transport: Most students fly to Nice Côte d'Azur Airport, which is 45 min' drive from Sophia Antipolis campus. Students can park in the campus. There is a bus line run by the General Council of the region that costs €1,50. All main locations around the campus are accessible by bus. There are two kinds of monthly plans available for students: Under 26 years old: €20 - Over 26 years old: €30.

Campus facilities: Computer labs and wireless networks are available on campus. 2 Trading rooms, 6 Amphitheatres from 150 to 600 seats, 50 Lecture rooms from 20 to 80 seats. Multimedia library.



LILLE – France

General background: The Lille campus is located in the town centre between the two railway stations (Lille Flandres & Lille Europe), next to the old town and the business centre. Lille is only 1 hour from Paris, 38 minutes from Brussels and 1h20mn from London. Lille is the main student town after Paris. The region is well known for its dynamic economic activity: several companies have set up their headquarters here in order to be logistically at the centre of Europe.

Food: Students can eat at the University Restaurant near the school. On the campus, a cafeteria offers quick snacks at reasonable prices. The school is located above the shopping centre where you can find Carrefour supermarket.

Transport: Most students arrive either at the Lille Flandres station or the Lille Europe station. Ilévia is the company that runs all the buses, tramways and metro. They offer low prices for students under 28.

Campus facilities: There are computer labs and wireless networks on the Lille campus, including the library and the common facilities.



GRAND PARIS - France

General background: Paris continues to be one of the most alluring cities in the world for cultural and economic activities. SKEMA Business School's Grand Paris Campus in Suresnes is a central site 13 minutes by car from Les Champs Elysées. The campus is spread across 14,000 m², including 1,500 m² of rooftop terrace with views of the Seine and the Eiffel Tower.

Food: Students have access to the cafeteria, which will serve a variety of international cuisine.

Transport: Most students arrive by Tram - line T2 (Les Coteaux) or by train - line L (Val d'Or) - or by bus - lines 175 (Clavel station), 263 Monge station) or 471 (Avenue de Suresnes station). They also can come by bicycle (Vélib) or by car (possibility to park in the Grand Paris Campus parking lot).

Campus facilities: The knowledge Centre is a space serving three functions: "library" (documentation), "factory" (production facility) and "academy" (research to train and educate). It is also virtual, via its data-rich resource portal that is accessible at all times.



RALEIGH - NC - USA

General background: The SKEMA US campus is situated in Raleigh, North Carolina, about 1h by plane from NYC. The SKEMA building is located on the Centennial campus of our partner North Carolina State University and is surrounded by many international companies.

Housing & Food: SKEMA provides students with a Raleigh Housing Guide which includes a number of student residences located on and around campus. All apartments are close to the SKEMA campus (access by bus) and fully equipped. The housing usually costs an average of €750/€1100 per month. Students can eat at university dining halls (cafeterias) or at several small restaurants/cafés on campus which serve breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Transport: The nearest airport to SKEMA US campus is Raleigh/Durham International Airport (RDU) which is about 24 km away. Your student ID gives access to the free Wolfline bus transport to go anywhere on campus and in Raleigh.

Campus facilities: Students have access to all NCSU facilities including impressive sporting facilities and libraries, bus lines, health centre, dining halls, and much more.

HOUSING ON FRENCH CAMPUSES: SKEMA campuses in France do not have on-campus accommodation but we have agreements with a number of residences located in the campus area. Housing usually costs an average of \in 650 up to \in 1000 per month. SKEMA provides a housing portal to assist students. For further information: <u>housing@skema.edu</u>

HEALTH INSURANCE FOR THE FRENCH CAMPUSES: Exchange students are required to arrange their own insurance covering illnesses and accidents during the period of their stay in France. All the international students attending SKEMA on exchange must purchase health insurance before applying for their student visa. Non EU citizen students studying for more than three months at SKEMA, are required to enroll in the French "Sécurité Sociale" once they arrive in France. All students must have repatriation coverage during their stay at the host country.



SUZHOU - China

General background: Suzhou has been called the Venice of the East because of its many canals, beautiful natural environment and traditional gardens. Situated one hour from Shanghai (2nd industrial city of China) Suzhou is a well-known high-technology centre with 118 of the top 500 companies in the world.

Housing & Food: SKEMA has negotiated a certain number of apartments close to the campus. The housing usually costs on average €350 per month. On campus, students can eat at several small restaurants and fast food restaurants which are all reasonably priced. Students can also prepare meals in their flats which are conveniently located to school.



BELO HORIZONTE - Brazil 📀

General background: Belo Horizonte, Brazil's third most important city for business, is 360km from Rio de Janeiro and 500km from São Paulo. It is ranked among the 10 most dynamic cities for business in Latin America by the magazine América Economia and is also considered the Brazilian Silicon Valley with more than 200 startups and 10 incubators.

Housing & Food: SKEMA has negotiated



DUBAI - UAE

General background: At the crossroads of the Indo-Pacific, Asian and African regions, Dubai is now one of the world's biggest magnets for talent. Located at the heart of the Dubai International Financial Centre (DIFC), this campus is a thriving hub for students keen on making an active contribution to the world of tomorrow and the renewal of a region long defined by its dependence on oil. In the United Arab Emirates, young people from around the world are eager to play a key role in a financial and economic centre of influence.



STELLENBOSCH South Africa

General background: By joining forces with Stellenbosch University, SKEMA has chosen a prestigious partner to establish its African campus near Cape Town, South Africa. Students benefit from the exceptional facilities offered by the university, including a vast library, a music school with concert halls, and first-class sports facilities (stadiums, gymnasiums, Olympic pools, etc.).

Transport: To get from the airport to campus, students can go by taxi (2h30 mn cost 600-800 RmB), train (1h30mn- cost 120 RmB) or bus (2h30mn- cost 130 RmB). As a service to students, SKEMA will be organizing shuttle buses from Shanghai Pudong Airport to Suzhou campus on selected dates at the beginning of each semester (cost 200 RmB).

Campus facilities: All essential services are available on campus: restaurants, laudromat, travel agent, phone card kiosk, buses, taxis, etc. Nearby, there is a large library and sport facility.

a certain number of apartments in hotel residences close to the campus. The housing usually costs an average of €800 per month. SKEMA also provides a housing portal to assist students. Students can eat in the dining halls (cafeterias) or at several small restaurants/

cafés on campus.

Transport: Flights from Europe have a layover in Rio de Janeiro or São Paulo airports before taking a domestic flight to Belo Horizonte. Students have access to the campus by public bus.

Campus facilities: Students have access to all facilities including impressive sporting facilities and libraries, computer labs, dining halls, and much more.

Currently not open to incoming exchange students.

Housing : Students are eligible for on-campus university housing and can also benefit from an extensive list of private accommodations.

Campus facilities: SKEMA students and participants will benefit from the many facilities of the Stellenbosch University that include an extensive library, a music school, concert halls, an athletics stadium, several Olympic swimming pools and sports fields (rugby, football, tennis, hockey, cricket, squash...).

Currently not open to incoming exchange students.
