13h10	Dr Vicky Phelan Cervical Cancer Activist	Vicky, a Limerick native and mother of two, received an honorary doctorate in the Irish World Academy from the University of Limerick on Tuesday, 26 th June, 2018. Vicky was diagnosed with terminal cancer in January 2018 and took the US laboratory that missed her diagnosis to the High Court. Phelan's high court case highlighted a national Cervical Check scandal and resulted in a €2.5m settlement. The lawsuit came as a result of her cancer diagnosis being discovered on a missed smear test taken as part of Cervical Check. Despite being told not to go public with what had happened to her, Vicky, determined and hopeful that raising awareness of the misdiagnosis would save the lives of other women, did just that.
