

AUDGPI & ICGP Joint Conference Abstract Submission Guidelines

Abstracts should be **maximum 350 words** excluding title and author information.

Guidelines for structuring your abstracts are as follows:

Research abstracts for oral or poster presentations should be structured as per peer-reviewed publications i.e. Introduction, Aims, Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions.

Education related abstracts for oral or poster presentations should also be structured to include Background; Aims/ Rationale of Teaching Activity; Target Audience of Teaching Activity; Nature/Content/Method of Teaching Activity; Evaluation/ Outcome of Teaching Activity; Future application.

Workshop abstracts should state the purpose of the workshop, the target audience of the workshop, the background/ rationale for the workshop, the plan for the conduct of the workshop including pre-work required from participants (if applicable), and the 'deliverables' it is hoped to achieve from the workshop.

Rapid Fire Ideas: 4 minutes talk time, 3 minutes for discussion. The floor is yours! Talk about your passion, idea, project, or thought. Share your fired up thoughts on passionate health projects, policies, collaborations, or initiatives. A maximum of 3 slides (or none!). Describe your Rapid Fire Idea using the following headings:

- Brief bio of how your life ties to the topic to be discussed.
- Explain why this talk is novel and special.
- What is the core idea?
- Takeaway message?

All abstracts should be submitted using the online form before 1700hrs December 8th 2023

This form will require the details of the presenting author, and all correspondence regarding the abstract will be directed to the email provided.

Submissions will also require you to select your preferred presentation type, which is not a guarantee that a presentation of that type will be offered – there will be a limited number of each category available.

Prizes are available for best research presentation, best education related presentation and best GP trainee presentation. Please indicate in your submission if you are eligible and/or wish to be considered for one of these prizes.

- Professor George Irwin Prize for best education presentation
- Professor James McCormick Prize for best research presentation
- Professor William Shannon Prize for best GP trainee presentation

An AUDGPI Bursary will be awarded to the overall best prizewinner. The purpose of the bursary is to promote the aims of the Association, and will support invoiced costs to attend an international conference to present work from Irish general practice.

Criteria for Orals and Posters

- Scientific importance
- Clarity – of aims and objectives
- Appropriateness of Methods
- Presentation of Results
- Conclusions – drawn appropriately from findings
- Likelihood of provoking discussion and/or change in practice

Criteria for Workshops

- Rationale
- Clarity – of aims and objectives
- Structure/ Format
- Clarity of outcomes/ deliverables
