Entry Requirements: Applicants must hold a second class honours primary degree (2.2) (Level 8 - National Qualifications Authority of Ireland). Applicants must be engaged in teaching in the higher or further education sector for the duration of this programme. Note: subject to the discretion of the course director, an interview may form part of the selection process.

In the case of International students, the overseas equivalent as determined by the Course Team in consultation with UL Graduate School Admissions, is required. Where candidates are non-native English language speakers, certified demonstrable achievement in a Standard English Language Competency Test will be required.
