DESCRIPTION OF THE AUSTRIAN GRADING SYSTEM:

The Austrian grading system offers a range of five different grades (1 to 5), with 1 being the highest and 5 the lowest grade. Students need to earn at least a grade of 4 in order to pass a course.

1 = very good

2 = good

3 = satisfactory

4 = sufficient

5 = fail
